# Safety

Read this manual carefully before starting or using the device. Always store the manual in the immediate vicinity of the device or its site of use.



### Warning

Read all safety warnings and all instructions.

Failure to follow the warnings and instructions may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

- Do not use the device in potentially explosive rooms or areas and do not install it there.
- Do not use the device in an aggressive atmosphere.
- Do not immerse the device in water. Do not allow liquids to penetrate into the device.
- The device may only be used in dry surroundings and must not be used in the rain or at a relative humidity exceeding the operating conditions.
- Protect the device from permanent direct sunlight.
- Do not expose the device to strong vibrations.
- Do not open the device.
- Do not remove any safety signs, stickers or labels from the device. Keep all safety signs, stickers and labels in legible condition.
- Use batteries of type AAA.
- Never charge batteries that cannot be recharged.
- Different types of batteries and new and used batteries must not be used together.
- Insert the batteries into the battery compartment according to the correct polarity.
- Remove discharged batteries. Batteries contain materials hazardous to the environment. Dispose of the batteries according to the national regulations.
- Remove the batteries from the device if you will not be using the device for a longer period of time.



- Never short-circuit the supply terminal in the battery compartment!
- Do not swallow batteries! If a battery is swallowed, it can cause severe internal burns within 2 hours! These burns can lead to death!


# **Device description**

The thermohygrometer is a battery-powered measuring device indicating the current indoor climate.

It comes with the following functional properties and equipment features:

- Simultaneous indication of time or date, room temperature, feel-good indication and humidity level
- Alarm function
- Indication of recorded minimum and maximum values for temperature and relative humidity
- Switching option between °C and °F
- Reset function
- Integrated stand for table installation
- Holder for wall mounting

# **Transport and storage**

# **Transport**

When transporting the device, ensure dry conditions and and protect the device from external influences e.g. by using a suitable bag.

When the device is not being used, observe the following storage conditions:


- dry and protected from frost and heat
- protected from dust and direct sunlight
- · at the temperature specified in the technical data
- battery is removed from the device

# Inserting the battery


### **Notice**

Make sure that the surface of the device is dry. Insert a suitable battery before first use as follows:



- 1. Open the battery compartment (10) at the rear of the device towards the direction of the arrow.
- 2. Insert the new battery in the compartment with correct polarity.
- 3. Close the battery compartment (10) at the rear of the device.

# Reading the display



No.	Indication	Meaning
15	Alarm	Alarm activated.
16	Hourly alarm	Hourly alarm activated.
17	AM	The time shown is in the morning (12-hour format).
18	PM	The time shown is in the afternoon (12-hour format).
19	MAX	The maximum value since the last reset is displayed.
20	MIN	The minimum value since the last reset is displayed.
21	COMFORT	Ambient temperature is between 20 °C and 26 °C, relative humidity is between 50 % and 70 %.
22	WET MAX	The relative humidity level is higher than 70 % (temperature-independent).
23	DRY MIN	The relative humidity level is lower than 50 % (temperature-independent).



### **Feel-good indication**

If the relative ambient temperature ranges between 20 °C and 26 °C (68 °F and 78.8 °F) and the relative humidity is between 50 % and 70 %, the *COMFORT* symbol for feel-good indication (21) appears on the display.

If the relative humidity exceeds 70 %, the *WET MAX* symbol (22) appears on the display regardless of the temperature and indicates that the humidity level is too high.

If the relative humidity falls below 50 %, the *DRY MIN* symbol (23) appears on the display regardless of the temperature and indicates that the humidity level is too low.

### **Notice**

Always make sure that the humidity level ranges from 50 % and 70 %.

If the relative humidity level is too low, this can often lead to headaches and the mucous membranes drying out, especially of nose and eyes. As a vicious cycle, this irritation increases the vulnerability for pathogens to exploit, and is therefore often the ideal basis for infections.

If the relative humidity level is too high, this will have negative impacts on the wellbeing of persons with a poor cardiovascular system in particular. Besides, in closed rooms that are insufficiently ventilated, there is an increased risk of mould growth which actually presents another risk for your health.

Therefore, always make sure that all rooms are well and regularly ventilated and ensure a healthy ratio of temperature and relative humidity.

#### Minimum and maximum values

The device saves the minimum and maximum values for temperature and relative humidity.

- Press the MEMO button (7) to display all measured maximum values (19) that have been measured since the last reset.
- 2. Press the *MEMO* button (7) again to display all measured minimum values (20) that have been measured since the last reset.
- 3. Press the *MEMO* button (7) again to exit the mode and to go to the standard display mode.

#### **Notice**


If you do not exit the display of the maximum and minimum values by pressing the *MEMO* button (7), the device will automatically switch back to the standard display mode after 10 seconds.

#### Switching the temperature indication between °C and °F

Press the  ${}^{\circ}C/{}^{\circ}F$  button (12) at the rear of the device to switch between  ${}^{\circ}C$  and  ${}^{\circ}F$ .

### **Basic settings**

### Info

You can readjust a value more quickly by means of the *ADJ* button (6) if you keep this button pressed.

Please proceed as follows to set time and date:

- 1. Press the *MODE* button (5) for approx. 2 seconds.
  - ⇒ The *Minute* indication (9) flashes.
- 2. Press the ADJ button (6) to adjust the minutes.
- 3. Press the *MODE* button (5) to switch to the *Hour* indication (8).
  - ⇒ The *Hour* indication (8) flashes.
- 4. Press the *ADJ* button (6) to set the hours.
- 5. Press the *MODE* button (5) to switch to the hour format setting (12/24).
  - ⇒ The previously set format starts flashing on the display.
- 6. Press the ADJ button (6) to set the desired hour format.
  - ⇒ If you select the 12-hour format, all times between 0:00 and 12:00 will be displayed with the symbol *AM* (17) next to them. Times between 12:00 o'clock and 24:00 o'clock will be displayed with the symbol *PM* (18) next to them.
- 7. Press the *MODE* button (5) to switch to the *Month* indication (24).
  - ⇒ The *Month* indication (24) flashes.
- 8. Press the ADJ button (6) to set the month.
- 9. Press the *MODE* button (5) to switch to the *Day* indication (25).
  - ⇒ The *Day* indication (25) flashes.
- 10. Press the ADJ button (6) to set the day.
  - ⇒ Time and date are now set.
- 11. Press the *MODE* button (5) to exit the setting mode.



### Display wake-up time

- ✓ The Time/date/wake-up time indication (1) shows the time.

  Both points between hour and minute display are flashing.
- 1. Briefly press the *MODE* (5) button.
  - ⇒ The *Time/date/wake-up time* indication (1) changes from indicating the time to indicating the wake-up time.
  - ⇒ Both points between hour and minute display stop flashing.

#### **Notice**

If no settings are made regarding the wake-up time, the display changes back to the indication of the time after one minute.

### Setting and activating the alarm clock



#### Info

You can readjust a value more quickly by means of the *ADJ* button (6) if you keep this button pressed.

Please proceed as follows to set the wake-up time:

- 1. Switch over to the wake-up time display by pressing the *MODE* button (5).
  - ⇒ The *Time/date/wake-up time* indication (1) changes from indicating the time to indicating the wake-up time.
  - ⇒ Both points between hour and minute display stop flashing.
- 2. Press the *MODE* button (5) for approx. 2 seconds.
  - ⇒ The *Minute* indication (9) flashes.
- 3. Press the *ADJ* button (6) to adjust the minutes.
- 4. Press the *MODE* button (5) to switch to the *Hour* indication (8).
  - $\Rightarrow$  The *Hour* indication (8) flashes.
- 5. Press the ADJ button (6) to set the hours.
  - $\Rightarrow$  The wake-up time is set.
- 6. Press the MODE button (5) to exit the setting mode.
  - ⇒ The alarm clock is activated.
  - ⇒ The *Alarm* symbol (15) appears next to the wake-up time set.

#### Switching off and deactivating the alarm clock

#### **Notice**

The alarm will stop automatically after 1 minute if no button is pressed.

- 1. To switch off the ringing alarm, press one of the buttons on the front of the device.
- 2. In order to permanently deactivate the wake-up function, press the *ADJ* button (6) three times.
  - ⇒ The *Alarm* symbol (15) is no longer displayed. The alarm clock is deactivated.

### Activate and deactivate hourly alarm

- 1. Press the *ADJ* button (6) twice to activate the hourly alarm.
  - ⇒ An acoustic signal is emitted every full hour.
  - ⇒ The *Hourly alarm* symbol (16) appears in the display.
- 2. In order to permanently deactivate the hourly alarm, press the *ADJ* button (6) twice.
  - ⇒ The *Hourly alarm* symbol (16) is no longer displayed. The hourly alarm is deactivated.

### Resetting the system

To reset the system of the device to the default configuration, press the *RESET* (11) button at the rear of the device.

Afterwards, the device will return to the preset default mode. All stored settings have been deleted.

# Maintenance and repair

### **Battery change**

A battery change is required if the values on the display are no longer or only partly visible. See chapter Operation.

### **Cleaning**

Clean the device with a soft, damp and lint-free cloth. Make sure that no moisture enters the housing. Do not use any sprays, solvents, alcohol-based cleaning agents or abrasive cleaners, but only clean water to moisten the cloth.

# Repair

Do not modify the device or install any spare parts. For repairs or device testing, contact the manufacturer.



# **Disposal**

Always dispose of packing materials in an environmentally friendly manner and in accordance with the applicable local disposal regulations.
